

Yellow petals with a long yellow trumpet. One of the earliest and longest lasting of all daffodils. Blooms in early spring. The blooms can last for a month. Among the very best daffodils for naturalizing. Full sun/partial shade. 8" $\mathbf{8} 12^{\prime \prime}$ tall.

Pueblo


Quite fragrant bloom. White petals with a pale yellow cup that fades to white. Clump forming with strapshaped leaves. Resistant to deer. Good for cut flowers. 6" - 12"

## Ice Follies



A white daffodil with a yellow cup that changes to creamy-white, with a light vanilla fragrance. Slow to multiply. Blooms mid to late February. Full sun. 16" - 18" tall.

## Double Campernelle



Dozens of petals neatly nested together like a perfect little rose. Very fragrant. A tough little daffodil with a 400 year history. 10" - 12"

Waterperry


A low growing, elegant daffodil that does best in some shade. Creamy-white petals and an apricot-pink cup. Cooler weather brings out the colors. 8" $\mathbf{- 1 2 \prime}$

## Carlton



A large daffodil with a sweet fragrance rather like vanilla. It readily multiplies and can form the backbone of your daffodil bed. Early to mid-spring bloomer. 16" tall

Gigantic Star


Very large, saffron yellow, long-lasting with a vanilla-like fragrance. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms early to midspring. 20" tall.

Quail


2-3 small, bright golden yellow flowers with an excellent fragrance. Plant in the front row. Blooms in February. 12" - 14" tall.

## Hawera



An elegant miniature with nodding, pale yellow florets having sweptback petals. Partial shade to full sun. Will also grow in alkaline soil. Multiplies. 8" - 10"

Petals of ivory-white and a cup of yellowish-white with a small delicate pink band at the rim. Cooler weather brings out the pink color. Full afternoon shade. 14"

Ceylon


Buttercup yellow petals with a large orange-red cup. Longlasting blooms excellent for naturalizing. Full sun to partial shade. Blooms early to midspring. 14" - 16" tall.
