#### Sustainable Practices for Residential Landscaping and Master Gardener Volunteer Development in Jackson County

The horticulture industry is a key role in the economy of Jackson County. Education of its producers on sustainable practices is essential for developing the industry and ensuring its producers stay in business. Many economic and ecological challenges face landscapers and homeowners of Jackson County. Among these are the rising cost of fuel, fertilizer, seed, pesticides, equipment, and the introduction and spread of non-native pest species. This program provides educational opportunities to homeowners, business owners, and Master Gardener Volunteers in Jackson County, along with the incorporation of 4H-Youth. The goal of this program is to increase awareness and adoption of the Florida Friend Landscaping <sup>™</sup> (FFL) Principles, while also teaching clientele different methods of sustainable home horticulture.

#### Improving Sustainable Horticulture Production in Jackson County

Sustainable production horticulture and agriculture practices are essential to the long-term viability and natural resources of Jackson County. With the rising numbers of first time and young famers entering the production population, improving existing practices and providing educational information and programming targeted to youth and small farm operations is needed. This program provides educational opportunities to commercial horticulture growers of Jackson County and surrounding counties.
